

## **Lafayette Weaver**

In the 1860 Anderson County, TN, Census Lafayette was listed as 9 years old living with his father and mother. In the subsequent census records he was listed as the head of the household. Lafayette was a farmer by trade. Lafayette and Parmelia inherited property from her parents. Additionally, they purchased 7 acres from her sisters beginning on the north side of Hinds Creek, Anderson County, TN, in October 1887 (Anderson County Deeds; W. S. Hutchinson et. al. to Lafayette Weaver-Vol NZ, Page 134).

The inscription on his tombstone says "Gone but not forgotten."

When Lafayette and Parmelia were married the ceremony was performed by J.M. McCloud, Justice of the Peace (Knox County Marriage Book5, Page 9).
